On admission, (R2) has elevated WBC count 12.3 and is requiring 10 L of oxygen. (R2) stated that his right knee is larger in size than his left knee and has been hurting since the past month. (R2) stated he had a fever of around 103 degree at home. Chest x-ray shows bilateral interstitial and airspace opacities likely representing infiltrate. Admitted for severe sepsis due to infection, possible PNA vs. acute or chronic R knee infection, worsening respiratory status in IMC.</p> <p>R2's facility 9/2018 Treatment Administration Record documents in part; Cleanse right knee and lower leg incisions with wound cleanser, cover knee with xeroform and wrap in kerlix and secure ace wrap applied loosely from the base of toes to thigh, knee immobilizer to be worn at all times, every night shift. V25 also stated the only thing stated to EMT's was that to let her get paperwork ready before they left. V2 returned with Facility's Medication Review report that documents acetaminophen 325mg-give 2 tablets q 6 hour prn (as needed) start date 7/20/2018. V2 unable to provide a MAR with acetaminophen order.</p> <p>Nurses Note 9/30/2018 at 10:58 AM Narrative: Writer called out to Dr. Resident is adamant about getting sent out to the ER. Awaiting a return call from Dr.</p> <p>Nurses Note 9/30/2018 at 11:03 AM Narrative: Resident has called paramedics himself from his personal cell phone. Paramedics arrived at 11:03. Writer advised paramedics that currently no orders are in place for resident to be sent out. Writer spoke with house supervisor. (A, B) (Section 2-107 of the Act)</p> <p>These Requirements are not met as evidenced by:</p> <p>Based on interview, observation and record review, the facility failed to provide timely incontinent care, assess/monitor for a urinary tract infection (UTIs), and failed to follow physician orders to discontinue a catheter for 1 of 3 residents (R7) reviewed for catheter use in a sample of 11. This failure resulted in discomfort from the catheter voiced by R7 and repeated UTI's.</p> <p>Findings include:</p> <p>1. The Admission Record documents R7 to be a 74 year old male admitted to the facility on 7/8/18 with diagnoses of Urinary tract infection, Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD), and Diabetes Mellitis (DM) in part.</p> <p>The Minimum Data Set (MDS), dated 7/16/18 and 9/14/18, identify R7 to require extensive assist of one staff for hygiene and total assist of two staff for bathing. The MDS documents R7 to have moderate cognitive impairment with a Brief Interview of Mental Status score of 12.</p> <p>Progress Notes reviewed from 8/5/18 to 8/10/18</p>	S9999

There are no entries between 8/5/18 - 8/8/18 and between 8/8/18 - 8/11/18.</p> <p>Progress notes dated 8/11/18 at 6:54am entered by V22, Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN), documents only that R7 was showered off schedule. At 9:44am, V22 documented in the progress notes "weekly skin observations."</p> <p>The next entry into the progress notes was on 8/13/18 at 11:22am when V22 documented in the progress notes that "unable to assess bm (bowel movement) res (resident) in hosp (hospital) since 8/11 (8/11/18.)"</p> <p>There is no indication as to why or what occurred that sent R7 to the hospital recorded in the progress notes.</p> <p>An eInteract Transfer Form, dated 7/8/18 entered by V21, LPN, documents "SBAR (Situation, Background, Assessment, Recommendations) Acute Change in Condition Note Included" with vitals recorded as "blood pressure 215/120, Pulse 75, Respirations 20, Temperature 97.5, O2 Sat (oxygen saturation) 97 room air." The form does not include an assessment of R7's status or current condition prior to his discharge via ambulance to the hospital. The form documents V24, Nurse Practitioner, was notified along with R7's POA (Power of Attorney), but not the attending physician.</p> <p>A "Nursing Home to Hospital Transfer Form" dated 8/11/18 documents the same vitals as the eInteract Transfer Form, but documents the reason for Transfer as "Altered Mental Status."</p> <p>On 10/26/18 at 3pm, V21, LPN stated she</p>	S9999

V21 stated she knew R7 was making inappropriate sexual advances while he said he was allowed to so she knew something was up with him. V21 stated she mentioned his behavior to the daughter who said that was out of character for him, he probably has a UTI (urinary tract infection). V21 stated the daughter insisted he may be having focal seizures and sent him due to her request. V21 stated she did not do an assessment of him at the time, but just sent him out.</p> <p>Emergency Department (ED) notes, dated 8/11/18 under "Physical Exam," documents "He is well-developed, well-nourished, and in no distress." "Staring into space, but eventually does respond to you. Did not look at me when I asked him questions. Just stared ahead and his lower lip and tongue was twitching. Then all of a sudden he would say soemthing that was related to the topic." Under History of present illness, it documents "(R7) is a 73 year old male with past medical history significant for COPD, hx (history) of CVA (Cerebral Vascular Accident), DM, HTN (Hypertension,) Lewy Body Dementia, and seizure disorder who since yesterday was not himself, more disoriented than usual and unable to speak. He was at his baseline early in the week which includes holding a full conversation, playing chess and eating well. However, he then started to act inappropriately by groping staff members and NH (nursing home) residents. Today they noticed he was starring into space and had strange tongue movements that they had never noticed before. He has hx of UTI's (last CX had ESBL (Extended spectrum beta-lactamases) proteus) which have made him confused in the past. Additionally, he has also had subclinical that</p>	S9999

The note document "Pt (patient) with confusion and significant UTI. Due to Delirium pt admitted to hospital for IV (intravenous) antibiotics and continued monitoring. No signs of severe sepsis/shock."</p> <p>Discharge Instructions, dated 8/17/18, include "remove (catheter) and voiding trials, periodic checks PVRs (Post Void Residual Urine tests.)</p> <p>Re-Admission Observations, dated 8/23/18 (6 days after readmission), entered by V6, LPN, documents R7 as "always continent", with a indwelling urianry catheter. V6 documents "urinary retention that causes persistent overflow" as the reason for the catheter.</p> <p>R7's care plan, dated 7/9/18 with a target dated of 12/13/18, failed to include any focused areas for urinary incontinence prior to R7's hospitalization and/or R7's repeated history of urinary tract infections including his most recent hospitalization. Nor does it reflect the discharge orders to do voiding trials and/or post void residual urine tests.</p> <p>Progress Notes, dated 8/17/18 19:36 (7:36pm), documents "incontinent of bladder. Resident has a catheter. Indwelling/catheter in place. Catheter patent/draining. Catheter care provided. Urine characteristics: amber. Resident uses bedpan. Resident uses toilet/commode. Resident uses pads/briefs, check and change."</p>	S9999		

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S9999	<p>Continued From page 14</p> <p>Progress Notes documented following R7's readmission from the hospital fail to include any assessment toward removing the catheter as ordered on the discharge record dated 8/17/18.</p> <p>A 8/28/2018 15:40 (3:40pm) PHYSICIAN PROGRESS NOTE entered by V23, Physician/Medical Director, documents "Patient complains of having a catheter, we need to ascertain the need to have this, otherwise it should be removed can you follow up with the Urology."</p> <p>Progress Notes dated 8/27/2018 at 7:00Pm entered by V23, LPN, documents "Nurses Note Narrative: Writer spoke with eldest daughter regarding catheter. Family is concerned that catheter is not getting emptied out. Writer assured the daughter that catheter will be emptied out by writer and that she should call back if any further concerns come up. Also she expressed that she wonders if he even needs the catheter since it was put in while he was hospitalized. Writer contacted V24, (Nurse Practitioner) regarding this matter."</p> <p>A Progress Note entered on 8/29/2018 at 6:00am, documents a Neurologist Note: "UA (urinalysis) C&S (culture and sensitivity) obtained at 0600 am and sent to the lab. Light yellow urine with sediment noted. Fluids encouraged. V15 (R7's Power of Attorney) aware.</p> <p>The September 2018 Physician Order Sheet (POS) documents an order to "DISCONTINUE CATHETER CAUSING RES DISTRESS AND BURNING No directions specified for order. 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S9999	<p>Continued From page 15</p> <p>Lab results of a UA collected 8/29/18 with results reported 8/31/18 document a UTI of >100,000CFU/ML (colony forming units/milliliter) Proteus Mirabilis. The results document V24, Nurse Practitioner (NP) for V23 was notified on 9/3/18, 3 days later of R7's UTI and lab results. V24 ordered Augmentin 875mg by mouth twice daily (BID.)</p> <p>The September 2018 POS documents an order to "dc foley cath No directions specified for order" dated 9/5/2018.</p> <p>The Progress Notes dated 9/5/18 at 1:29pm, documents R7 to be "incontinent of bladder. has catheter." There is no progress note that documents when R7's was actually discontinued.</p> <p>Treatment Administration Records (TAR) and Medication Administration Records (MAR) for August and September 2018 fail to reflect any care provided to R7's catheter ie catheter care, recorded output and changes.</p> <p>The facility's policy/procedure entitled "Urinary Catheter Care" dated 1/17/17 documents the purpose of the policy is "to establish guidelines to reduce the risk of, or prevent infections in resident with an indwelling catheter." The Guidelines document "Routine Hygiene (e.g. cleansing of the meatal surface during daily bathing or showering in appropriate." and "The date of the catheter insertion shall be documented in the nurses notes and treatment record.</p> <p>Progress notes dated 10/18/2018 at 14:20 (2:20pm) documents "Note Narrative: Resident refused multiple times to staff that he would not get up and take a shower. Family requested for " UA & CS to be done and to straight cath if needed."</p> <p>Labs results document the urine specimen was collected 10/22/18, 4 days after V15 requested it, with results given on 10/25/18. The note documents R7 was started on Cipro 750mg daily for a UTI on 10/24/18. The C&S results identify the source as 10,000-50,000CFU/ML of Proteus Mirabilis which is resistant to Cipro.</p> <p>On 10/25/18 at 4:48pm, V2 DON stated the nurses already identified the resistance and contacted the nurse practitioner who changed the order to Bactrim.</p> <p>On 10/23/18 at 10:10am, R7 was his wheeldchair fully dressed at bedside. R7 was asleep, leaning to the left. R7 remained asleep at bedside and was observed to eat lunch while in his wheelchair at bedside. At 1:45pm, R7 was still in his wheelchair at bedside. At 2:30pm, R7 remained asleep in his wheelchair. At 2:45pm, he was in his wheelchair when V18 and V20 Certified Nurse Aides (CNAs) entered the room to transfer him. V20 had to go to another floor to get a partial mechanical lift (Sit to stand.) R7 was transferred to bed. and his pants removed. R7 had deep red/white creases throughout his abdomen, hips, buttocks, upper posterior thighs and buttocks. R7 had been incontinent of bowel and blader. Incontinent care was provided but no barrier cream was applied. R7's deep creases remained throughout the care which ended 3:15pm. R7's left elbow, which he had been leaning on his wheelchair armrest with, had an oval deep red area that did not seem to blanch. R7 was left on his back in bed, no preventative</p>	S9999

V15 stated R7 had a history of UTI's and exhibits similar symptoms when he starts into it. V15 stated each time he's had a UTI, including the time he went to the hospital, she's had to tell them. V15 stated she visits in the evening in August, she had asked for a UA C&S which took days to get. The day he went into the hospital 8/11/18, she told the nurses he was not right around 10am and he declined until she finally convinced them to send him into the hospital. V15 stated R7 ended up staying in the hospital for a week. V15 stated when he returned, he had a catheter which she kept asking about removing. V15 stated he developed another UTI before they got it out. V15 stated she was just called last night and told he had another UTI. V15 stated she had requested days before for them to get another UA because he was not acting himself.
