ILHPG/ IDPH Responsibilities

Step 1: Stakeholder Identification

- Recruit/ retain ILHPG members who represent Illinois's diverse HIVinfected populations.
- Identify key stakeholders and agencies that can inform and support development and implementation of the jurisdictional HIV prevention plan.

Step 2: Engagement Process

- Work in collaboration to identify strategies that increase coordination between HIV care, treatment, and prevention, and to identify and address gaps, challenges, and barriers to accessing HIV care, treatment, and prevention services.
- Include people living with HIV, populations at high risk of HIV, community stakeholders, and service providers in HIV program planning and service delivery.

Step 3: Jurisdictional HIV Prevention Plan

- Elicit input from ILHPG members, community stakeholders and providers on development, update, and implementation of the jurisdiction's HIV prevention plan.
- Provide a letter of concurrence, concurrence with reservations, or non-concurrence (with the Jurisdiction's Plan) to CDC, annually.


