WHEREAS, Illinois' major racial and ethnic minority groups, account for approximately 38.4 percent of the state's population; and,

WHEREAS, celebrated every year in April, National Minority Health Month is an effort to raise awareness about health disparities that continue to affect racial and ethnic minority populations; and,

WHEREAS, the mission of the Center for Minority Health Services at the Illinois Department of Public Health is to improve the health and well-being of Illinois' minority populations through the development of health policies and culturally and linguistically appropriate programs to eliminate health disparities; and,

WHEREAS, in accordance with this year's National Minority Health Month theme, "#VaccineReady" the Illinois Department of Public Health's Center for Minority Health Services will raise awareness on the disproportionate impact the COVID-19 pandemic is having on racial and ethnic minority and American Indian and Alaska Native communities, and will focus on empowering communities to get the facts about COVID-19 vaccines, share accurate vaccine information, participate in clinical trials, get vaccinated when the time comes and practice COVID-19 safety measure;

**THEREFORE, I**, JB Pritzker, Governor of the State of Illinois, hereby recognize April 2021, as **National Minority Health Month in Illinois**, in support of the Center for Minority Health's efforts to help eliminate health disparities, accelerate health equity, and make the state of Illinois a stronger and healthier state.
