
Have You Recently Had a Baby?



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What is PRAMS?



The Illinois
Pregnancy Risk
Assessment
Monitoring System
(PRAMS) is a survey
that asks new
mothers questions
about their
pregnancy and their
new babies. It is a

cooperative project between the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

What Information Does PRAMS Collect?

The survey includes questions about experiences before, during and after pregnancy. The answers give us important information about



the mother and the baby. They help us learn why some babies are born healthy and others are not.

How are Mothers Chosen to Participate in PRAMS?



Mothers' names are selected by chance from the state birth certificate registry. About 2,400 mothers will be chosen each year to help us in this study.

Are My Answers Really Important?

Yes, very important! Only a small group of mothers will receive the survey. Every pregnancy is different.



To get a better overall picture of the health of mothers and babies in Illinois, we need each mother who receives the survey to answer the questions. No matter how your pregnancy went, your answers will help improve the health of future mothers and babies in Illinois.

Will My Answers be Kept Private?



Yes, all answers are kept private as provided by Illinois State law. All answers given on the questionnaires will be grouped together to give us

information on Illinois mothers and new babies. No reports can be traced back to individual mothers responding to the survey.

How Can I Help?

If you receive a PRAMS survey in the mail, please fill out the survey and return it in the postage paid envelope. Mothers receive a small gift



when the survey is returned. A list of programs and resources that can assist the mother after her delivery is included with the survey.
