**1.2**k deaths in 2019


### Racial disparities in prostate cancer

There are large racial disparities in prostate cancer incidence and mortality.

Black men are at a higher risk of getting prostate cancer, and a much higher risk of dying from it.

#### Incidence rate


**1.5x higher** in Black men than White men.


#### Mortality rate

**2.4x higher** in Black men than White men.

#### Disproportionately more Black mortality



# Without public awareness, the disparity in deaths between Black men and White men will remain.

- Inform the public about the risks of prostate cancer, as well as the benefits and uncertainties about prostate cancer screening.
- Customize messaging to Black men about prostate cancer risks.
- Encourage Black men, beginning at age 45, to discuss their risk of developing prostate cancer and screening options.
