



SUMARY Cannabis is the single most versatile herbal remedy, and the most useful plants on Earth. No other single plant contains as wide a range of medically active herbal constituents"

On January 1st, 2014, Illinois approved the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act (410 ILCS 130), which allows patients with qualifying debilitating medical conditions to register with the state to obtain cannabis for medical use. On August 12, 2019, the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Program Act became a permanent program, and the "pilot" designation was removed. Illinois was the 20th state to authorize a legal medical cannabis program. As of June 2021, 36 states, Washington, DC, and the territories of Guam, Puerto Rico, the Virgin Islands, and American Samoa have legalized the use of the cannabis plant for medical purposes.

Public Act (P.A.) 98-0122 provides Illinois residents who have various qualifying debilitating medical conditions (as defined by the Act), access to medical cannabis and protects qualifying patients, their Health Care Professionals and Caregivers, from criminal and civil liability. The Act defines "medical use" as the acquisition, administration, delivery, possession, transfer, transportation, or use of cannabis to treat or alleviate a registered qualifying patient's debilitating medical condition or symptoms associated with the patient's qualifying condition.

As of 8/02/2021 our department services 161,059 Medical Cannabis Patients and 783 Opioid Alternative Patients.

FY21 Accomplishments

On June 22nd the Medical Cannabis Patient Program went "live" with their new Entellitrak system. As of 8/17/2021 there are a total of 300 defects in the system. The system was taken down for two weeks for data migration and upon launch crashed for approximately two weeks. The Medical Cannabis Division continues to work through ongoing defects in the system.

Due to the Coronavirus outbreak, the Governor implemented an emergency procedure in March, 2020 to renew Medical Cannabis cards for 1 year free of cost for those patients whose cards were set to expire between March 20th- September 30th, 2020. This was extended through July 30th 2021.


Passing of SB 2023 (PA 101-0363) allowed for: • Applicants with lifelong conditions (designated by their health care providers) will only be required to submit \$50 fee and a current driver's license to renew their cards for three years • Allows both adult and minor applicant to have up to 3 caregivers with the restrictions that all caregivers can • Applicants 65 and older are added to those eligible for reduced fee along with veterans and those receiving

Passing of HB1443 on July 15 2021 allowed for: • This provision removes the requirement for patients to have to designate one dispensary at a time. They


MCPP -Registered Patients by Age and Gender

Number of Patient Waivers by Allotment










OAPP-Registered Patients by Age and Gender
























Number of Registered Patients by Nature of Condition




