

WHEREAS, the Illinois Department of Public Health acknowledges that there is no safe level of lead in the body; and,

WHEREAS, childhood lead exposure contributes to learning disabilities, developmental delays, behavioral problems, and other negative health effects; and,

WHEREAS, Illinois passed the Lead Poisoning Prevention Act in 1973 to set mandatory assessment, testing and reporting requirements in addition to establishing the Lead Poisoning Prevention Program in the Illinois Department of Public Health to monitor the identification and treatment of lead exposed children; and,

WHEREAS, in 2018, Public Act 100-0723 was signed into law, which requires public health intervention at 5 micrograms per deciliter of lead in blood; and,

WHEREAS, since the beginning of the Covid-19 pandemic, childhood blood lead testing rates have declined approximately 22%; and,

WHEREAS, in 2021, Illinois identified more than 3,400 children with blood lead at public health intervention levels; and,

WHEREAS, the major source of lead exposure among Illinois children continues to be lead-contaminated dust and lead-based paint banned in 1978; and,

WHEREAS, the Illinois Department of Public Health Lead Program is committed to bringing awareness for the need of children to be evaluated for lead exposure; and,

WHEREAS, Illinois is pleased to join with health care professionals, agencies and their delegates in observance of National Lead Poisoning Prevention Week, and in an effort to increase awareness and promote prevention of lead exposure in children;

**THEREFORE,** I, JB Pritzker, Governor of the State of Illinois, proclaim October 23-29, 2022, as **Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Week** in Illinois and encourage all citizens to recognize the prevalence of lead exposure in our society and to join in working toward eradicating this unfortunate and unnecessary condition.
