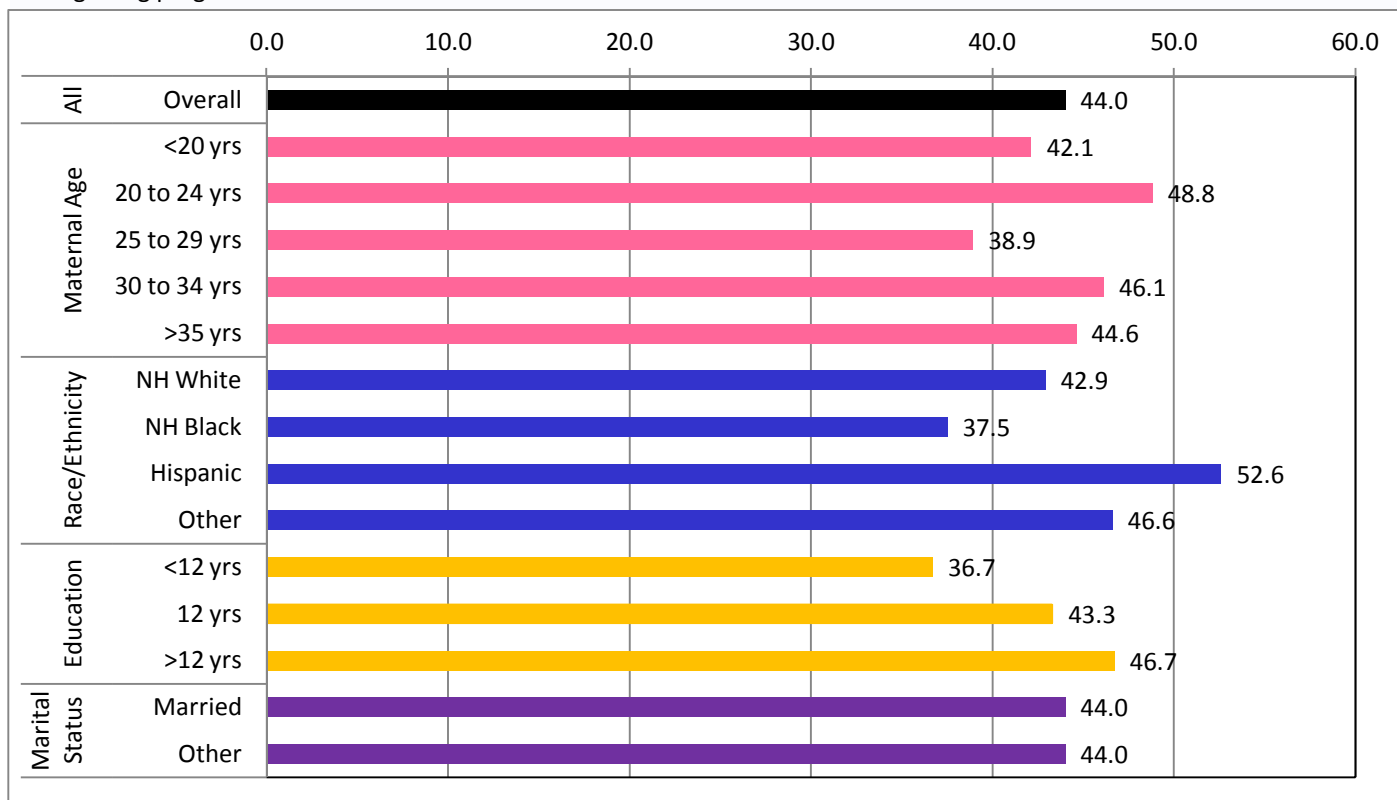


Reported Use of Birth Control Before Pregnancy
