Having Sex?

Learn more about the Zika Virus

In some places, Zika virus is primarily spread by infected mosquitoes. However, it can also be spread by having sex (vaginal, oral, anal) with a person who has Zika virus.

If a woman is pregnant and gets Zika virus, her baby can be born with serious birth defects.



To avoid Zika virus and/or a Zika virus-affected pregnancy, talk to your health care provider about your family planning options.
